European Board Examinations in Urology EBU Oral Examination - Saturday 2 June 2018

1) Venue

2) Provisional Programme

08.00-12.30: Examination sessions 1-4

13.35-18.00: Examination sessions 5-8

19.30-20.15: Announcement of results and diploma ceremony

Candidates are strongly recommended to be present until the end of the programme.

3) Registration

The candidate should report to the EBU staff at the registration desk **30 up to 10 minutes before the scheduled start of his/her examination session**. The candidate receives a badge with a personal CID number (**Candidate Identification Number**) and photo; the badge must be worn at all times. The following registration procedure is applicable:

- The candidate presents a valid **passport** or **identity card**;
- The candidate hands in his/her cell phone.

Five minutes before the examination session, the candidate is accompanied to the examination room by one of the EBU hosts.

4) Examination

The candidate is examined by a team of two urologists and will be presented three clinical cases representing a wide spectrum of urologic practice. The objective is to test the candidate's ability to evaluate and manage common cases in every day practice.

The examination session lasts maximum 55 minutes.

5) Sequestering

To ensure a fair examination the candidates of examination sessions 1,2,3 and 5,6,7 will have to remain at the venue until the examination sessions 4 and 8 have started. The respective candidate is accompanied to the designated waiting room once his/her examination session has ended. In the waiting room the use of electronic equipment is NOT allowed; candidates not adhering to this policy may be disqualified. In the waiting room drinks will be served.

6) Cell phone policy

The use of cell phones is not allowed in the examination or waiting rooms. The candidate has to leave his/her cell phone at the registration desk. The return policy is as follows:

- The candidates of examination sessions 1,2,3 and 5,6,7 will receive their cell phones before leaving the waiting room.
- The candidates of examination sessions 4 and 8 collect their cell phones at the EBU registration desk on the 1st floor after their session.

7) Lunch

Lunch and refreshments are available at the hotel's restaurant at the candidate's expense.

8) Announcement of the results

The Examination Committee will announce the CID numbers of the candidates who have failed the examination. The other candidates are congratulated on having passed the examination.

9) Re-examination

Starting 2018, the re-examination is discontinued.

10) Presentation FEBU Diploma

The presentation will take place on the 1st floor; room to be announced.

There will be three desks divided by CID number. Candidates can collect the (provisional) diploma at the respective desk upon handing in of their badge.

The following policy applies for successful candidates.

- **Certified Urologist:** Will receive the FEBU-diploma and can use the FEBU-title.
- **Final-year Resident:** Will receive a Provisional-diploma.
The Provisional-diploma states that the holder is entitled to obtain the FEBU-diploma, and may use the FEBU-title, only after having submitted a copy of the certificate of accreditation in urology at the EBU office.
A candidate registered as resident who has recently obtained the national certificate of accreditation in urology and provides the EBU office with a copy of the certificate by e-mail before 15 May 2018, will be presented the official FEBU Diploma instead.

11) Smoking

Smoking is not allowed in the registration area and in the examination or waiting rooms.

12) Dress code

Business casual.

14) Scoring system

General: The candidate's mark in the EBU Online Written Examination varies between 6 and 9.

Oral examination: Each case scores on a 1 – 4 scale. The following items are judged and scored:

Diagnostic Acumen (history, exam, tests)	1	2	3	4		0

0 (zero) = dangerous response = absolute failure

Scoring per clinical case per candidate:

- Score = 3 – 12.

After 3 cases the overall score per candidate is determined:

- Maximum score = 36.
- Passing score = 24, without an absolute failure.

The marks are transcribed on a 1 - 10 scale as follows:
