

## FEBU (INTERNATIONAL) PART 2 ORAL EXAM – SCORING SYSTEM

### General

The candidate's mark in the Part 1 Written Exam varies between 6 and 9.

### Scoring

The candidate is scored by two independent reviewers.

Each case scores on a 1 – 4 scale based on the following 3 factors:

1. Diagnostic Acumen: History, exam & tests
2. Clinical Judgement: What to do
3. Therapy: How to do it

Scoring per clinical case: minimum 3 and maximum 12.

The overall score is determined depending on the number of cases.

### 3 cases

- Maximum score = 36.
- Passing score = 24.

The marks are transcribed on a 1 - 10 scale.

- Maximum score = 48.
- Passing score = 32.

The marks are transcribed on a 1 - 10 scale.

- Maximum score = 60.
- Passing score = 40.
