1. WHAT YOU NEED

a) Laptop or Desktop



b) Google Chrome



To take your exam, you need a computer as the chrome's plug-in required to share your screen is only compatible with a laptop or desktop.

The installation of software on your computer is not necessary. However, you are strongly advised to use Google Chrome so you can run the latest version of our <u>screen sharing extension</u>.

c) A photo ID



We need to identify you with a valid passport or ID card that has your name and photo on it.

d) Smartphone or tablet



You are required to use the camera of your smartphone or tablet.

You will need to download our app which is compatible with any Android 8+ or higher and iOS (Apple) 15.8+ or higher.

To download the iOS app, click <u>here</u>. For Android, click <u>here</u>.

e) A steady internet connection



We require a steady internet connection (Wi-Fi will be required for mobile streaming) with a **minimum upload speed of 1,5 Mbps** (be careful: this is not your download speed).

We strongly recommend you use an ethernet cable for your computer to ensure a stable connection. Disconnect any VPN.

When taking the exam at a hospital or clinic a firewall may be active. Have the IT department check the required access to assessmentQ URLs via this link <u>https://support.televic-education.com/hc/en-</u> <u>us/articles/115002200334Firewall-access-to-assessmentQ-URLs</u>

2. HOW TO SETUP YOUR ENVIRONMENT

a) Your room is well lit



You should be clearly visible at all times. Through the setup process, you will be able to see what your webcam is sharing.

Make sure that lighting is sufficient and no backlighting.

b) You are alone in the room



c) Your camera is positioned correctly

You should be the only one taking the exam, having someone else in the room is a serious violation. Make sure to cover any irrelevant private information you would not like to show, such as pictures or private objects.

For both your webcam and smartphone camera, we need to be able to see you and your surroundings well. Check the video feeds which are presented on your screen once you start your exam, they will show you exactly what is recorded and how.

3. WHAT YOU SHOULD AVOID

a) No extra devices



Aside from your smartphone it is not allowed to use additional devices such as second screens or tablets.

b) No headphones



c) No talking (or singing)



We need to be able to hear what you are hearing in order for the exam to be valid.

Any noise and talking will be analysed for suspicious behaviour, so make sure you are in a quiet environment and that you refrain from talking out loud.

d) No toilet breaks



You will need to remain within the camera frame during the exam, so toilet breaks are not allowed. Make sure you go before starting the exam.
